Tuna shouts,

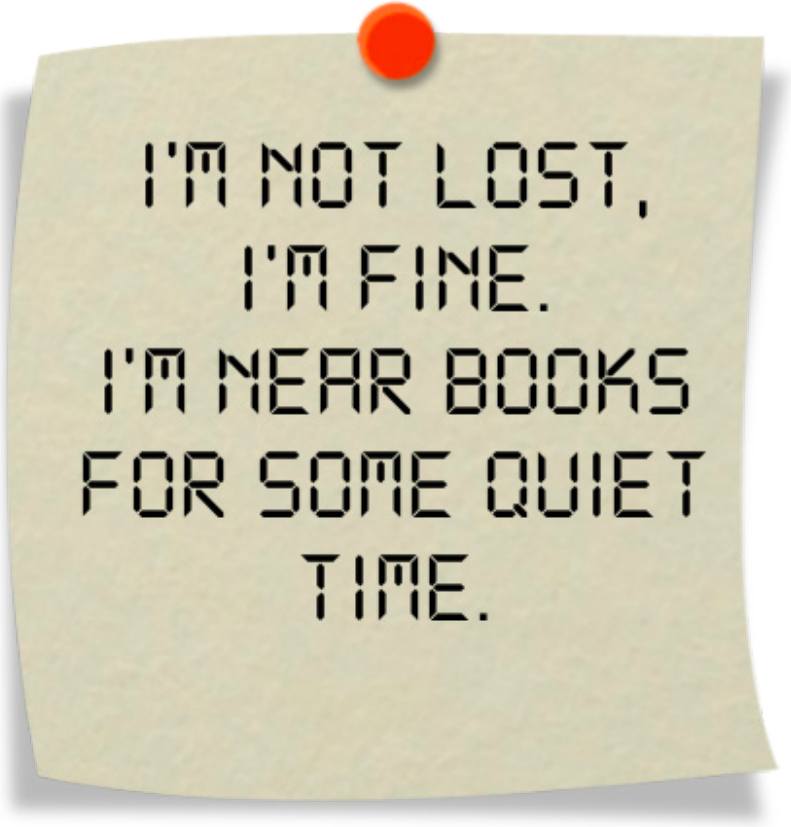
"Where is Robi? Oh, no! Is it lost?"

This time, Eda finds another note on the noticeboard and reads it quietly. It's a new message from Robi,

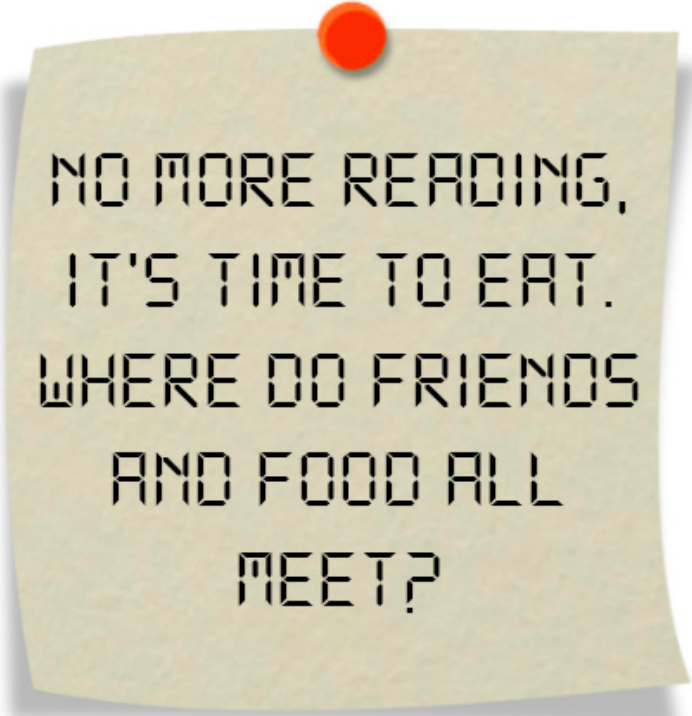
"No more reading, it's time to eat. Where do friends and food all meet?"

"Haha! Your robot is hungry, Tuna," says Eda.

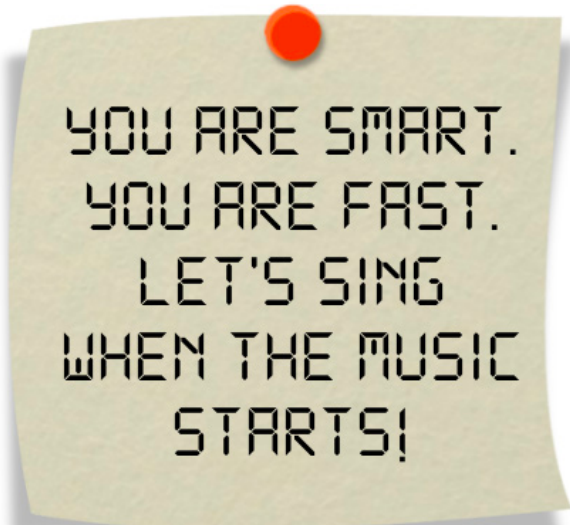
"It must be kidding!"

ROBOT RULES

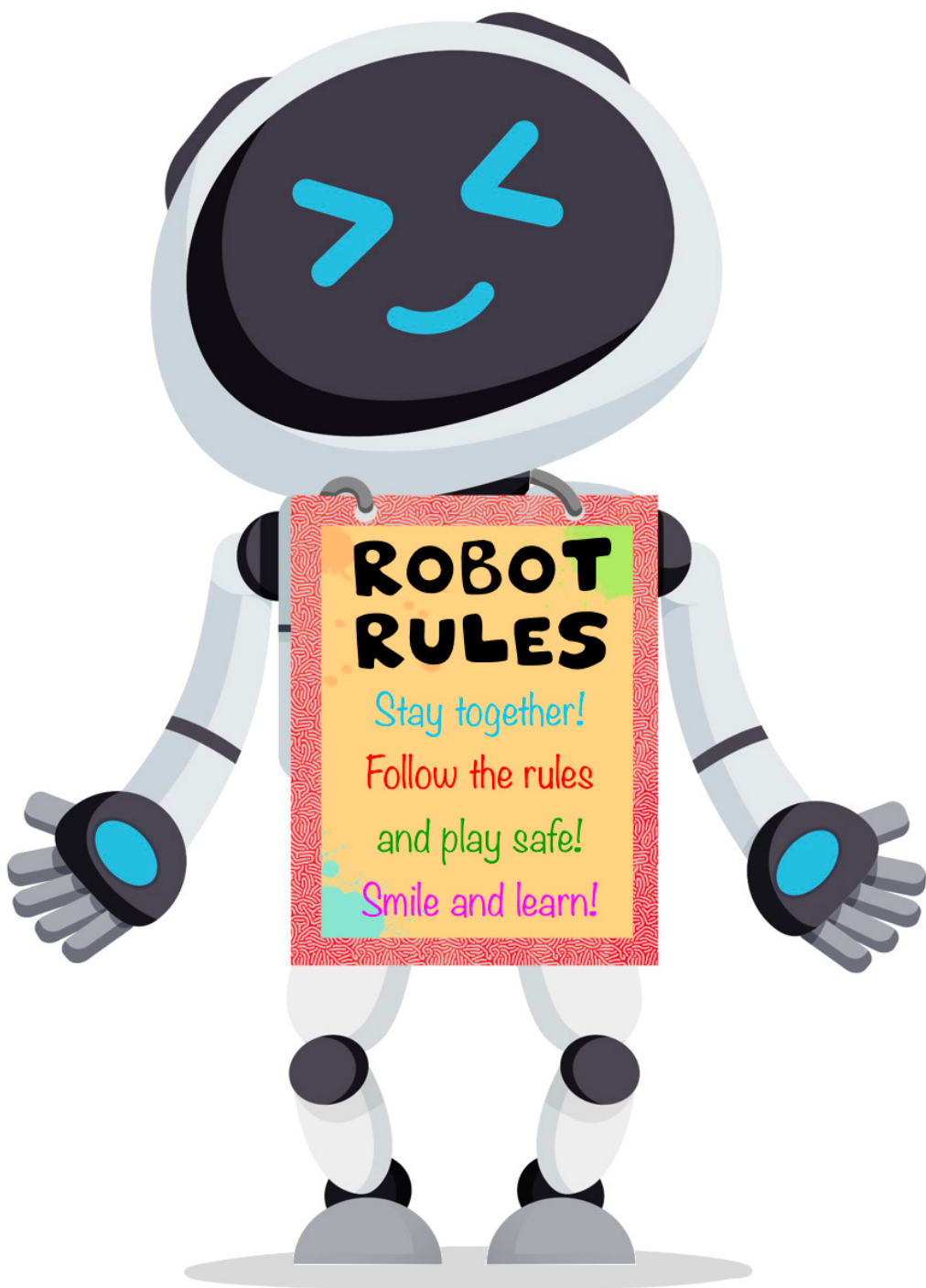
Stay together!

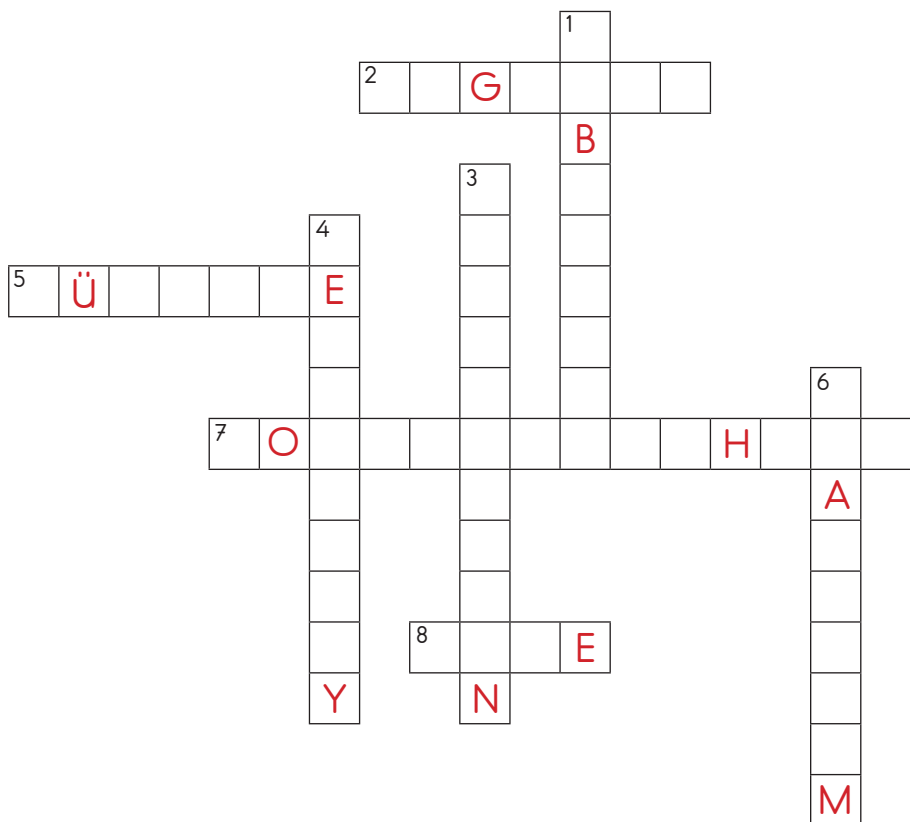

celebration (n): a special event or activities to mark an important day

classmate (n): someone who is in the same class with you at school

conference hall (n): a large room used for meetings or events

corridor (n): a long passage inside a building, with doors to rooms on both sides

creative (adj): having the ability to produce original ideas or things

drama club (n): a school group where students act in plays or practise drama

festival (n): a special time or event when people celebrate something

follow (v): to go after someone or something; to move behind

hurry up (v): to do something more quickly

Information Technology (n): a school subject in which students learn to use computers, software, and other digital tools
